Message from Mrs Procter

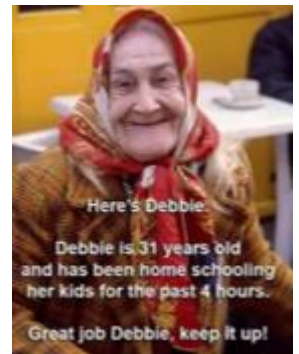


Well you have all completed a full week of home learning. I hope that none of my parents look like this after their first week!
