#### **Weekly Reflection**

#### Ethos Statement – I understand the importance of peace.

The Beatitudes tell us what our attitudes should be. Jesus said, "Blessed be the Peacemakers" - a peacemaker makes peace. We get our example of a peacemaker from the Bible, of course. Isaiah 9:6 says, "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Jesus is the Prince of Peace. He is our example of how to bring peace and get along with everyone. Jesus is the Son of God. When we follow Jesus by making peace, we are showing that we are children of God, like Jesus is.

It is our job to be like Christ. We are meant to be at peace with everyone, but this does not mean that we can force others to be at peace with us. Sometimes, as a child of God, people just won't like you. Keep the words of Romans 12:18 in mind. "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone." You can't make everyone happy. Sometimes people will just want to fight. But don't give in! When this happens, continue to practice the Beatitudes.

# Wirral Grammar School for Girls 11+ Support – Message from the Headteacher



Due to COVID restrictions, we may not be able to offer Saturday morning 11+ familiarisation sessions this July for Year 5 girls. We have bought into the Grammar School Headteachers Association contract with C.E.M/GL test providers which were originally set up for the King Edwards Grammar

School Trust in Birmingham. This provides on-line familiarisation which we can offer free for any Year 5 girl that is interested in taking the 11+ this September. The comprehension section is not in the GL test but the verbal, non-verbal and maths are.

The company 'Frog' is the provider and requires each pupil to register for the familiarisation on-line webinar. I would be most grateful if you could direct any Year 5 girl who is interested to our website for more details or it can be accessed via the link below.
