Weekly Reflection

Ethos Statement – I can use words to make the world a better place.

One of the smallest words we can say that makes a great difference is 'sorry'. Sometimes we say it so quickly and so often that we do not really think about what we are saying and we do not always truly mean it. Jesus tells us that we need to be contrite – truly sorry for what we do wrong and that when we are sorry we should not only use the word but try and make up for our mistakes by changing our behaviour too. In the story of The Prodigal Son we learn how God is there waiting for us to come back to him and say we are sorry. If we do, then he will always forgive us no matter what we have done wrong. If it has been a while since you last went to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, then perhaps you could consider seeking God's love in this special way. If you have not made your First Reconciliation yet, then maybe you could say a little sorry prayer to God.

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Ash Wednesday 14th February

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Our foreheads are marked with ashes to humble our hearts and remind us that life passes away on earth. We remember this when we are told "Remember, man is dust, and unto dust you shall return." Ashes are a symbol of penance and contrition but they also remind us that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him. We are called to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance. What can you do this Lent to prepare for Easter? How can you help those in need? Can you try and pray a little more each day? Can you give something up in order to help others? Perhaps you could receive the sacrament of reconciliation? Whatever it is that you decide to do this Lent, remember that God is with you always and you can ask Him for help when you are finding it hard.

FS2 Trip to Imagine That!

We will be going to an interactive museum on Wednesday 20th March 2024.

The trip will include a minimum of three science workshops. The trip will provide lots of hands on opportunities for us to explore and learn about science. They have introduced some exciting new workshops including exploring the properties of solids and gases in an amazing visual experience.

If that is not enough, we then get to explore all of the different areas:

imagination village, creation area (we get to paint on cars!) and science investigation area (where we stand inside a giant bubble!).



The cost of the trip is £18.50 which must be paid via ParentPay before 13th March. Your child must wear their school jumper or cardigan but can have their own t-shirt and bottoms. A packed lunch from the school canteen will be provided for the trip and the children with allergies will be catered for. We will leave and return within school hours so drop off and pick up times will remain the same as a normal school day. This trip was fantastic last time we went and we are really looking forward to taking the children.

Year 1 visit to Hayrack Church Farm

As part of our spring Science topic and instructions in English next term, Year 1 will be visiting Hayrack Church Farm on Friday 19th April. Children will get an interactive session for a hands on experience to meet spring baby animals, entry to an indoor soft play room, adventure playgrounds, bag of food to feed an animal of choice, make a bird feeder and paint a ceramic pot. Lunch will be provided by school. The cost of the trip, including coach will be £16 and paid via ParentPay.

Year 4 trip to Royal Liverpool Philharmonic

On Friday 8th March, Year 4 will be taking a trip to the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Hall to watch a concert to celebrate the Olympics in Paris this coming summer. We have booked tickets for this day at 10:30am. We will be travelling there and back by coach and leaving school at 9:15am and returning in the middle of lunchtime. We ask that all children bring a packed lunch on this day; unless you are entitled to Free School Meals, where a sandwich option will be provided. We will eat once back at school.

The tickets cost £12.50 per child and this will now be live on ParentPay.
