# BOYS conjunctions

- To make our sentences even more interesting we can use conjunctions to link ideas together: if we can use: but, or, yet and so.
- Each conjunction has a different meaning in a sentence. Look below for some examples.

- But tells us something got in the way:

We wanted to put out the fire **but** ...the wind prevented us.

- Or compares options.

It is hard to tell if the fire was left on.... **OR** .... the embers relit.

- So tells us what we did next.

The wind was strong and blew the fire onto the near by buildings **SO..** our only option was to pull them down.

- Yet is like but something stopped this from happening.

People tried tirelessly to put out the fire ...**YET...** the buckets were too small and the fire too big.
