Scarlet fever and Strep A

We have had a few confirmed cases of Strep A within school- although I am very pleased to report nobody is too poorly. Scarlet fever is caused by bacteria called group A streptococci. These bacteria also cause other respiratory and skin infections such as strep throat and impetigo. **Scarlet fever is usually a mild illness**, but it is highly infectious. Therefore, please look out for symptoms in your child which include - a sore throat, headache, and fever, along with a fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel. On darker skin, the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel. Contact NHS 111 or your GP if you suspect your child has scarlet fever, because early treatment of scarlet fever with antibiotics is important to reduce the risk of complications such as pneumonia or a bloodstream infection. If your child has scarlet fever, keep them at home until at least 24 hours after the start of antibiotic treatment to avoid spreading the infection to others.

Weekly Reflection

The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means 'rejoice' and we are invited to find joy in something that will last. We are told to rejoice in the fact that Jesus, the Son of God, is coming to be close to us at Christmas. The Christmas story can become so familiar to us that we can forget how profound and incredible it is. What can a baby, a poor family and a dirty smelly stable got to do with our lives? It shows us the kind of God that Jesus is. God love us so much and so deeply that He comes to us wherever we are. This is certainly joyful. Jesus loves us so much and wants to be close to us. Let us pray that we can find the real joy in Christmas over the coming days.

New Year Resolution- start each day on time for a full day of learning

Persistent late arrival at school not only affects the learning of the student arriving late, but also the learning of the rest of the students in the class. Ongoing, persistent lateness, after the registration period has closed, can lead to statutory measures being used by the Local Authority.

Can we also remind parents that when possible, appointments should be made for pupils at the end of the school day so they are not leaving class early and disrupting the lesson (we appreciate that there are times when it is beyond your control).

Persistant lateness and early leaving over a school year can often accumulate to several days missed learning for students and may be drawn to the attention of the Local Authority resulting in a fixed penalty notice.
