Every child who orders Christmas Dinner will be issued with a ticket on the morning of 15th December to hand to kitchen staff in return for their Christmas Dinner.

If your child is in KS1 and will not eat a Christmas lunch they may bring in a packed lunch on this occasion only. In order that we can order the correct number of meals please advise the school office before 8th December if your child will be bringing a packed lunch on this day.
