Message from Mrs Procter



Well that is it, you have all completed your last day of homelearning, well done to you all! On Monday all children will return to school and we cannot wait. Work will be posted on Seesaw for any children that have to self-isolate but hopefully that will not happen too often. As I have said before school reflects our local community so we all need to remember that we are only in step one of coming out of lockdown -

we are not allowed to have friends over to play, sleepovers, birthday parties or meeting friends in the park after school - we want school to remain open this time around so we must all follow the guidance to keep each other safe and the R rate low. Can I please remind parents that when they are dropping off their children they must wear a mask and ensure that they remain socially distanced whilst waiting. We have staggered the times again to try to ensure that all children are not coming out at the same time, please read carefully what time your child is coming out from school and only come at that time not 15 minutes before as that defeats the object as you will be waiting on the yard.

The children will return to school as we did in September, so FS1, FS2 and Y1 to enter school through Little Acorns gate, Y2 and Y3 through the main school entrance path and Y4, Y5 and Y6 through the Church gate. The gates will open at 8.30am and close at 8.50am each morning. Pick up at the end of the day will again be staggered to ensure that we do not have too many parents on the yard at any one time. FS1 3.25pm, FS2 3.15pm, Y1 3.10pm, Y2 3.05pm, Y3 3.10pm, Y4 3.10pm, Y5 3.05pm and Y6 3.15pm.

Whilst lockdown has been hard on us all there have been some good things to come out of this. We have all had more time with our families than we would have had, I have really enjoyed sitting down together as a family each evening for tea instead of the usual rushing to drop off and pick up from clubs. We have learnt to appreciate the small things in life that we usually take for granted like meeting a friend for a walk. Weekends have become quieter and less expensive as we cannot go out to places but we have all found free activities to enjoy like a walk in the woods or a family games night. Some of us have developed new skills like cooking from scratch or baking. We will look back on this time in years to come I am sure and will miss the slower pace of life that we were forced to take. There have also been some things that we have learnt to appreciate more, many parents have told me they appreciate our teachers more and do not know how they manage with a class of thirty!! For me it is hairdressers I that I appreciate more as I cannot wait to have my hair done!!!

As a school we will continue with some of the changes that we have made during lockdown, homework will be set on Seesaw each week and we will offer zoom parents' evenings as the feedback we have had has been really positive as it has meant parents could attend the meetings even from work and the appointments did not run over quite so much. SLT will remain on the gates each morning as we enjoy seeing the children each day and it means the teachers have the chance to set up for the day in their classrooms.

Next week when the children return to school the expectation is that they will be in full school uniform. I realise that over the last seven weeks some of them will have had a growth spurt and you may now find that some items do not fit. The uniform shop is open for click and collect orders. School shoes need to be worn but if your child has grown out of them then they may return in a pair of dark shoes or trainers **but** only until the shops re-open and you can buy new ones. I ask that you work with school on this and if your child does still fit into their shoes then they wear them.

On PE days children should come in to school wearing their **school PE kit** - black or navy blue tracksuit bottoms or leggings, white school PE t-shirt and school jumper/cardigan/hoody and trainers. Children are not permitted to wear any other coloured sports clothing or t-shirts. Over the last few weeks we have seen patterned and flowered leggings and a whole range of sports attire that looks like we are in sports direct!!

Your children may bring a school bag into school if they need to, packed lunches may be brought in for KS2 but KS1 are not permitted to bring in a packed lunch as they will have a school dinner. Our kitchen can cater for any fussy eaters so please call the school office if you are concerned.

To celebrate returning to school we will be celebrating World Book Day on **Monday 8th March**. We would like all children to come to school in their party clothes with their favourite story book. We will be having a day off



timetable and will be doing some fun activities within school as it will be a party day!! There will be a change to the lunch menu, on offer will be chicken nuggets and chips or hot dogs as well as the deli bar and of course no party would be complete without ice cream for dessert. The cooks are baking a special celebration cake for each class to enjoy in the afternoon. We might have to remain in our bubbles but one thing we know how to do at Christ the King is party so we will have a day to remember!!
