#### **Summer Uniform**



When we return to school after the Easter break, children should wear their summer uniform. #### ParentPay Fraudulent Email

We have been made aware of a fraudulent email sent to one of our parents apparently from ParentPay. The email states that a bank transfer from the recipients debit card has not been successful and that they should click on the link to pay the balance immediately. In this instance our parent was



being asked for  $\pounds 240$  for school lunches. We have made ParentPay aware and their security department are investigating.

ParentPay will never contact parents to ask for payment. If your child's account is in debit you will receive a text or call from the school office asking you to bring your account up to date but please, never click on any links asking you to input your bank details as these messages will not be from either ParentPay or school. If you ever have any queries regarding your account please call the school office.

# **Collection of Children**

When collecting your children at the end of the day could we please ask you to leave the school grounds promptly and not allow children to play on or use equipment which is outside classrooms. This is for class use only to reduce the risk of germ spreading and crossing bubbles and will have been sanitized ready for the class to use the following day. Your cooperation is appreciated.

# Stations of the Cross

During Lent, all classes have been joining in Jesus' footsteps to the cross through focusing on the stations of the cross. For over two thousand years, people have journeyed to the Holy Land to see where Jesus lived, died and rose again. The journey is called a pilgrimage, and every place pilgrims visit is called a station.



Many people could not make a pilgrimage. The Holy Land was too far away, or countries were at war. So the stations

of the cross were created. This way, the people who were not able to reach the Holy Land could still make the journey in their hearts. At each station we say a short prayer and study the picture. We have enjoyed spending this special time with Jesus and thinking about how each station can teach us something about how we can live our own lives.
