Please note that the Old Hall where we will spend most of our day is not heated, so the children will need to dress accordingly.

**Vikings** - Girls - long dress under a tunic/apron held up by a pair of brooches, sometimes joined by a chain or string of beads, shawl, thick woolly socks, soft leather shoes.

Boys – Woollen shirt underneath a tunic or a three-quarter coat and belt made from fabric. Long cloth trousers held up by a sash or drawstring, thick socks, leather shoes or long leather boots.

Both men and women wore fur or woollen hats and cloaks in cold weather. Cloaks were fastened at the shoulder with a brooch or pin.

**Anglo Saxons –** Girls – Long plain dress/tunic with jumper underneath, cloak (old curtain/blanket) fastened with brooch, short boots or wellies, long hair should be tied back or plaited.

Boys – Sweater under a plain tunic, cloak (old blanket/curtain) fastened at shoulder with fancy brooch, belt around middle, dark trousers.

#### Y5 Victorian Visit to Port Sunlight

As part of our Victorian topic, we will be studying the local history of Port Sunlight and why Lord Leverhulme decided to settle there. We will be going to Port Sunlight on Friday October 4th, during the day we will attend workshops based around Victorian life, go on a guided walking tour of the village and look in the exciting museums. We will be getting the train to and from Port Sunlight, due to this we will need some parent helpers for the day (approximately 7!) please let Miss Lloyd or Mrs Kane know if you are able to help, it's much appreciated! All children will need a packed lunch in a labelled plastic bag. The cost of the trip will be £9.50, please pay this via ParentPay as soon as possible.
