#### **School Uniform Policy**

Please can we remind parents that at Christ the King we expect that our children adhere to our uniform policy. In recent weeks we have seen unsuitable hair cuts and the wearing of earrings. All of our school policies can be found on the school website – an excerpt of our Unform Policy is below to act as a reminder:

- For safety reasons, children are not permitted to wear jewellery in school. This includes earrings of any kind. If a child needs to wear a piece of jewellery for medical or religious reasons, it should be removed or covered up during physical activity with a letter written to explain the reason;
- Nail polish, hair gel, jewellery other than watches, should not be worn;
- Shoulder length hair and longer should be tied back neatly, with plain maroon or yellow bobble. Small bows/headbands may be worn in school colours. Boys hair should not be any shorter than a number two.

Whilst the children are permitted to wear a watch, this does not include Smart watches as they allow the sending and receiving of messages. Children are permitted to wear a basic Fitbit style watch only.
