### Message from Mrs Procter



As you know, media coverage of the coronavirus is widespread, and both the global and national situations are rapidly evolving. We are following the advice given by the DfE on a daily basis. At the moment prevention is still the main priority within school. We have discussed the best ways of preventing

the spread of the virus with the children whilst addressing any misconceptions that the children may have and that could be causing them worry. All children are reminded and supervised with the following:

- > Frequent hand-washing with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
- > Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- > Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then discard it in the bin or to sneeze, cough into their elbow if they do not have a tissue.

Our school cleaners are exceptional, and already utilise strong practices for preventing the spread of viruses this includes the frequent disinfection of surfaces such as desktops, tabletops, doorknobs, light switches etc.and an aggressive approach to surface disinfection within school will continue.

We are trying to ensure that all children are in school as any days lost will have a huge impact on their education. The advice is, if a family member is suspected to have the virus that children **MUST** still come to school but parents to ensure that they wash their hands before they leave the house and as soon as they arrive in school. Any families with a confirmed case in the home then the children will need to stay at home and self –isolate- work will be provided for them from school. If a child develops a high temperature 37.8 degrees and above or has a new continuous cough then they must stay at home.

I am quite enjoying hearing the children singing Happy Birthday as I walk around school whilst they are washing their hands! Please do not hesitate to get in touch if we can assist with any further information.
