### Message from Mrs Procter



As you will all be aware from the local news COVID rates in Wirral still remain very low but are beginning to rise again. Thankfully, our cases in educational settings also remain extremely low. However, as predicted and expected (with the easing of lockdown restrictions), there are signs of increasing cases across Cheshire and Merseyside. For Wirral, we currently have very low numbers of confirmed Indian variant cases, but this is being closely monitored and there is also a delay of a few days between someone being confirmed positive via PCR and us knowing whether they have a VOC or not. I have been advised by public health England this week that parents of primary aged children should consider testing themselves twice a week, free testing kits can be collected from any Covid testing site or ordered online. It is not advised for children to be tested by lateral flow tests. While convenient to use these at home, the difficulty in carrying out a nasal and throat swab with a young child means that the test results are often not valid. Also, everyone who has at least one of the 3 main COVID symptoms (high temperature, new continuous cough, loss of taste/and/or smell) should have a PCR test. If parents have a symptomatic child, they need to book a supervised PCR test (see [www.wirral.gov.uk](http://www.wirral.gov.uk) for local details)

Please can I remind all parents that masks **must** be worn on site and that parents need to follow our one way system around school. These measures have kept us safe for the past nine months as we have had very few cases within school. If we all continue to follow the guidelines for the next few weeks we will hopefully not have to close any bubbles!!

I know that the children are all looking forward to the break the rules day next Friday - I may need therapy after if, especially if I am forced to wear JoJo bows for the day!!
