Unfortunately the children keep telling me they have brought in the maximum amount of money as they cannot wait to see me forced to wear Jojo bows - watch this space!!



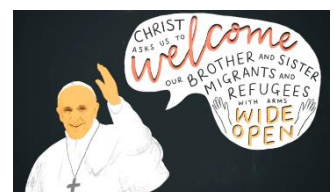
### Weekly Reflection
