Walk to School Week and Cleaner Air Campaign

A generation ago, 70% of children walked to school. Data shows today that it is now less than 50%. We'd like to play our part in reversing this decline and also help with levels of pollution around school by encouraging more families to walk to school. Our school council have been educating themselves about air pollution and will present this to the school as well as taking some air pollution measurements and recording how many people are walking/scooting/riding to school. They would like to challenge you to swap two of your car journeys each week for a walk to/from school - or park at least 3 streets away and walk the rest. By 15th May, which is national walk to school week, we would like to see if we can get back to 70% of our community walking to/from school for at least 4 out of 10 journeys per week. As an incentive, children will earn a Strider badge. Please try to help us meet this challenge, if you can.

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Persistent Lateness

Persistent late arrival at school not only affects the learning of the student arriving late, but also the learning of the rest of the students in the class. Ongoing, persistent lateness, after the registration period has closed, can lead to statutory measures being used by the Local Authority.

Can we also remind parents that when possible, appointments should be made for pupils at the end of the school day so they are not leaving class early and disrupting the lesson (we appreciate that there are times when it is beyond your control).

Persistant lateness and early leaving over a school year can often accumulate to several days missed learning for students and may be drawn to the attention of the Local Authority resulting in a fixed penalty notice.
