Message from Mrs Procter



Welcome back to our final term of the year, as usual this term is one of our busiest with sports days, curriculum afternoon, brass band concert, choir showcase, transition to new classes, please make sure you put the dates in your diary! The children and staff returned to school this week refreshed after a lovely week in the sunshine, taking assembly on Monday morning I felt like I was on my holidays as the smell of sun cream in the hall was lovely- long my this weather last! Please ensure that your child has a cap/ sunhat in school each day and a water bottle as we do not have much shade on the field at lunchtime in this lovely weather.

Some of our children are accessing YouTube and TikTok and downloading videos that they think are funny but the content is not appropriate. I realise that all children have access to the internet these days but we all need to work together to ensure the Safeguarding of our children. We will continue to teach the children about online safety in school through our computing curriculum.

Weekly Reflection

Ethos Statement – I know how to show I am sorry.

Some people are good at saying 'Sorry, Sorry, Sorry,' but often they don't mean it and don't try to change to show they are really sorry. The story about Zacchaeus in Luke's Gospel shows us that not only did he say sorry to Jesus for all the money he had stolen, but he also he told Him how he was going to show he was sorry. Zacchaeus said, "I am going to give half my belongings to the poor and if I have cheated anybody, I will pay him back four times the amount." This made both Zacchaeus and Jesus very happy because it showed that Zacchaeus was truly sorry for his actions and wanted to change his behaviour. So the next time you need to say sorry to someone, think about what you could do to show that person that you are contrite and really do mean what you say.

Prayer Sponsors Thank You



Year 5 Liverpool World Museum trip
