## Weekly Reflection

## Attendance

Please find below some thought provoking information, facts and figures from Wirral Borough Council with regards to pupil attendance.

- Missing 2 days per month means a child is missing 10% of their school year
- Increasing your child's attendance by just 5% can **DOUBLE** the chances of gaining good qualifications.
- Good attendance in Primary School improves reading and maths skills
- Turning up just 5 minutes late every day adds up to 3 days lost in the year.
- More school= Higher grades/ Increased confidence/more friends/ brighter future
- 95% attendance or more gets your child's life off to a flying start
