Ethos Statement – I try to be accepting of others

St. Paul understood this and used the image of the body to help explain to the followers of Jesus how God's family is just like a body. Everyone is different but everyone is of equal importance.

Some people we might not even like very much but they are important to the whole body, the whole family. St. Paul tells us that we all have gifts everyone has something useful to offer God's family.
