### World Book Day

At CTK we will be taking part in World Book Day on **Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March**. As part of our reading culture that we have in school we will be sharing books, authors and stories all day across classes and year groups.

All children are invited to get creative and make their own accessory or prop that their favourite book character might wear or hold, and their class and teachers will have to guess who it is from the clue. They could make a hat, badge or hairband, or bring in a prop (cuddly toy, cape, wand, basket) that links to or represents their favourite story. Alternatively, they could create an envelope or bag of clues to share in class. Children can wear their own clothes on this day too.

We are also bringing back the popular 'Book Swap Shop' this year and are kindly asking for child friendly book donations, that are in good condition and your family are ready to pass on to another child. When your child brings in a book to donate they will be given a raffle ticket in school which they will exchange for a book from the Swap Shop in the hall on World Book Day. Book donations can be brought into school on the first week back after half term.

## FS2 Trip to Imagine That!

We will be going to an interactive museum on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

The trip will include a minimum of three science workshops. The trip will provide lots of hands on opportunities for us to explore and learn about science. They have introduced some exciting new workshops including exploring the properties of solids and gases in an amazing visual experience.

If that is not enough, we then get to explore all of the different areas:

imagination village, creation area (we get to paint on cars!) and science investigation area (where we stand inside a giant bubble!).

**The cost of the trip is £18.50 which must be paid via ParentPay before 13<sup>th</sup> March.** Your child must wear their school jumper or cardigan but can have their own t-shirt and bottoms. A packed lunch from the school canteen will be provided for the trip and the children with allergies will be catered for. We will leave and return within school hours so drop off and pick up times will remain the same as a normal school day. This trip was fantastic last time we went and we are really looking forward to taking the children.



## Year 1 visit to Hayrack Church Farm

As part of our spring Science topic and instructions in English next term, Year 1 will be visiting Hayrack Church Farm on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> April. Children will get an interactive session for a hands on experience to meet spring baby animals, entry to an indoor soft play room, adventure playgrounds, bag of food to feed an animal of choice, make a bird feeder and paint a ceramic pot. Lunch will be provided by school. The cost of the trip, including coach will be £16 and paid via ParentPay.

## Year 4 trip to Royal Liverpool Philharmonic

On Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March, Year 4 will be taking a trip to the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Hall to watch a concert to celebrate the Olympics in Paris this coming summer. We have booked tickets for this day at 10:30am. We will be travelling there and back by coach and leaving school at 9:15am and returning in the middle of lunchtime. We ask that all children bring a packed lunch on this day; unless you are entitled to Free School Meals, where a sandwich option will be provided. We will eat once back at school.

The tickets cost £12.50 per child and this will now be live on ParentPay.
