# Weekly Reflection

#### Ethos Statement – I know it is ok for me to make mistakes.

Luke's Gospel is full of stories about people who made lots of mistakes in their lives. Gospel means 'good news' and the good news that Jesus told us about was that it's OK to make mistakes. We often learn by making mistakes and it doesn't make God love us any less. The story of the Prodigal Son is a great example of this. The younger son recognises his mistakes and decides to return to his father to ask him for paid work. Before the son has got near the house the father has seen him and rushes out to greet him and welcome him home. This is what God is like. He is always looking out for us and waiting for us to recognise the mistakes that we make. He will welcome us back to him without hesitation. As we approach the season of Lent, perhaps it is time for us to think about receiving God's love in the Sacrament of Reconciliation knowing that God is always there to welcome us back to Him.

# KS2 Skipping Workshop Tuesday 5th March

Skipping Workshops Ltd are holding a KS2 skipping workshop where every child will have the opportunity to learn a range of skipping skills. The team coach will work with groups of children from years 3 through to 6 throughout the day, introducing a variety of skipping skills, catering for all children throughout all classes. The gymnastic speed ropes the children (infant or junior) will be using during the day will be on sale at home time and for a further period at a cost of £4.80 each. For parents who are interested in exercising with their children, or who simply want some useful exercise themselves, special adult ropes are available at a cost of £6.00 each. The ropes are made to a high standard, are light and easy to use and allow children and adults to progress rapidly with their new skills.
