## The Ascension

The Feast of the Ascension is always celebrated on a Thursday. Forty days after Easter, we commemorate the day Jesus ascended or went up to Heaven. On the Ascension, Jesus and his disciples gathered together for the last time. While they were together, Jesus was taken up to Heaven and disappeared into the clouds.

In the Acts of the Apostles, it says, in Jesus' own words, that he went to prepare a place for us: And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be.

The most important thing to remember about the Ascension is that Jesus is always with us even though He is not present physically. It is similar to when a parent goes away on a business trip. They may be gone, but they still love us and they will come back. Sometimes our feelings do not allow us to see the whole picture. We need to take comfort in the knowledge that Jesus always keeps His promises.

Children from Years 2-6 joined the parish for Mass on Thursday and Fr Humphrey reminded us that Jesus wants us to follow Him so much. He showed us how to live before He went away and he desperately wants us to follow his example.

signed out on the Friday with the staff and brought back in on the following Thursday am. We look forward to seeing you there.


