This week has been quite a challenge to say the least but it has been lovely to see the children and staff pulling together as a family, it really makes me realise what a special place we have here at Christ the King. Thank you for all of your lovely messages of support as we come to terms with our loss, it means a lot to the staff.

The children have all spent two days with their new class teachers and all seem very excited for September to start. Our new Y6s will be going into the hub in September and they have already renamed it the Y6 HQ!! It was lovely being on the yard on Wednesday night watching the excitement as the children came out to tell parents who their new teacher would be. We do these transition days to help reassure our children over the summer holidays, any children that we feel need an extra visit or transition booklet to bring home will have them over the coming weeks.

A staffing list has been sent to you all and you will have seen that Mrs Kilfoyle has been appointed our new SENCo, she has been working closely with Mrs Jones over the last few weeks to ensure that she has a clear understanding of all of our children on the SEND register. I believe that the parents WhatsApp groups have been on fire stating that a part time SENCo is not acceptable. I would just like to reassure all parents that Mrs Kilfoyle is fully up to speed and will be able to manage the role within her three days non-teaching as Mrs Jones did before she became Assistant Headteacher and came out of the classroom fulltime. We have separated Mrs Jones' other roles of ELSA and pastoral lead to Mrs Risk and her management roles will be covered by SLT. As always parents will be able to contact a member of SLT if they have any issues on the two days that Mrs Kilfoyle will be class based.

You will have seen that Miss Hughes' name was not on our list. Miss Hughes has been with us on supply two days a week, and has been offered four days a week in the other school that she currently works in. We have loved having her as part of our team and will be very sorry to see her go!
