This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Termly units are taught in classes. These bespoke units are directly informed by the Model Music Curriculum (March 2021). Lessons are a minimum of 30 minutes and are taught by class teachers or a music specialist. Teaching is supported by specialist planning, and the *Charanga* curriculum scheme of work. This musical learning is further supplemented by weekly singing assemblies, featuring "composers of the week", lasting 30 minutes.

Children from EYFS to Year 6 have access to chromatic glockenspiels, percussion and recorders for whole-class ensemble work. Each unit culminates in filmed performances.

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Christ the King Catholic Primary School, we currently offer individual and small-group lessons on keyboards/piano, guitar/ukulele, recorders and brass through Front Row Music Service, visiting and onsite specialists.

We have a thriving and award-winning choir, an award-winning recorder club which is going from strength to strength, and a thriving and popular brass band. All ensembles meet weekly and are provided by visiting or onsite specialists.

Individual and small group lessons are funded by parents. However, the choir and recorder club are completely free for participants.

We work closely with Front Row Music, our onsite specialists and Edsential to ensure we can offer the best possible music opportunities for our children. - Y1-6 Watch and analyse each other's performance videos using musical vocabulary.

In the future

- Introduction of further whole-class ensemble projects delivered by a music specialist.
- Further develop performance opportunities for our young musicians throughout the school year.
- Further develop engagement in extra-curricular music for Pupil Premium and SEND children.
- Develop a dedicated music teaching space for use by ensembles and class curriculum
