

## **MFL POLICY**

## Autumn 2024

AIMS	Modern Foreign languages are a valued part of the curriculum at Christ the King Primary
	School. Learning languages contributes to mutual understanding, a sense of global
	citizenship and personal fulfilment. Our aim is to encourage pupils to understand and
	appreciate different countries, cultures, communities and people. We aim:
	To help children foster positive attitudes towards foreign language learning.
	To enable children to develop linguistic competence such as listening and
	speaking skills.
	To enable children to develop an awareness of simple language structures and
	to express themselves in another language.
	To allow children an opportunity to explore their own cultural identities and
	those of others.
	To help children appreciate similarity and difference in the world about them
APPROACH	As the children move to Key Stage 2, they will learn French. This language will be taught
	over a 4 year cycle.
	Strong links will be made with other areas of the curriculum and the children will be
	encouraged to apply their PMFL knowledge throughout their daily activities.
	The children will learn about the importance of cultural identity alongside the language
	being taught.
	Through their understanding of different cultural identities the children will be
	encouraged to develop their feelings and 'empathy' for others.
	We will use the ilanguages program as a resource to support the teaching of French.
RESOURCES	This will roll over from year group to year group. This scheme supports pronunciation
	of spoken language.

TIME	40 minutes per fortnight in KS2.
ALLOCATION	
ASSESSMENT	We will use the ilanguages assessment booklet, which covers reading and writing in
	French, as well as aural assessments to ensure that children understand and respond
	to the spoken word, as well as the written language.
MONITORING	There is a bi- annual review of this policy by the MFL Subject Leader. Implementation
AND	of MFL will be monitored by Lead through triangulation of evidence.
EVALUATING	
	The Curriculum committee of the governing body is briefed to oversee all policies. Any
	changes made to this policy will be communicated to all teaching staff
