KS2 production will be in church but we will be splitting the performances so that we have a Y3-4 and Y5-6 production, again this is to limit the numbers.

All parents will be required to wear a mask in the hall/church for the safety of all, as the last thing I want to do is to infect the staff or our families the week before Christmas!

We will record all of the Christmas productions and send out the links to parents to ensure all your family can join in the fun as we are aware that some people may not feel happy being part of a large audience.

It has been a difficult decision to make this year as Covid has certainly not gone away but we feel by having smaller numbers at any one time we will be minimising the risks as much as we can. We cannot wait to celebrate Christmas as a school, it is always an exciting time and one that the children really enjoy.
