



## Super Sentence Stackers: Bao

This week's sentence stackers is a Pixar short called Bao, you might have seen it before. It is about a very sad mummy, who misses her little boy. Magically she creates a little baby bao but sadly things don't quite go to plan for little Bao.

Remember you should write 9 sentences or less about ONE CHUNK of the story- don't retell the whole thing. This will give you chance to develop interesting vocabulary and really think about making an exciting piece of writing for your audience.

Make sure you watch the lesson first and listen carefully to what you need to do.

The challenges for this week are: 1. Adverb ly (Example: Nervously, mum peered over the table to look at the strange shrieking bao bun).

2. Feelings (Example: She realised she wasn't going to feel alone anymore and her heart felt almost like it was going to burst because it was so full)

3. Precise verb -a more clear verb, instead of using happy you could use ecstatic or instead of cry you could use weep.(Example: Mum was so happy she began to weep tears of joy )
