

Super Sentence Stackers: Mouse for sale

This week our short film is called 'Mouse for sale', it is about a small mouse called Snickers who really wants someone to buy him from the pet shop but he has one very BIG problem.

Remember you should write 9 sentences or less about ONE CHUNK of the story- don't retell the whole thing. This will give you time to really think about developing interesting vocabulary.

Make sure you watch the lesson first and listen carefully to what you need to do.

The challenges for this week are:

1. Complex sentence: but (Example: Snickers really wanted someone to take him home but because of his big ears people didn't want to).

2. Repetition (Example: Snickers was hopeful someone would see past his ears. He was hopeful they would realise that it doesn't matter what you look like. Snickers was hopeful that someone would realise all that mattered was what is inside your heart.)

3. Tenses- correct tense (Example:
