Friday 24th June 2022 is our School Diversity Day. This year we are having an Art Focus enrichment

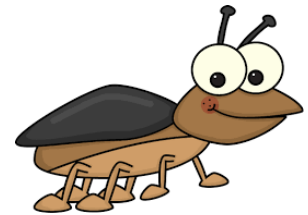
Day.  Each year group will share work of a diverse artist and create their own interpretation. On this day the children can come to school dressed in your favourite colour. As bright as you like
