

Super Sentence Stackers: Lifted

This week our short film 'Lifted' tells the story of

Remember you should write 9 sentences or less about ONE CHUNK of the story- don't retell the whole thing. This will give you time to really think about developing interesting vocabulary.

Make sure you watch the lesson first and listen carefully to what you need to do.

The challenges for this week are:

- 1. Precise verb- instead of still- up level to tranquil (Example: The night was tranquil).
- 2. Personification- the swing grouned, the door screeched shut. (Example: Suddenly, the swing grouned and the wind vein screeched as if they were trying to warn the farmer that something sinister was looming.)
- 3. Adverbial phrase: How, why, what, where- Suddenly is a very good example of a fronted adverbial. (Example: Dazzling like diamonds, the stars blanketed the canvas of black and hanging proudly in the midnight sky was the moon like a giant, luminous pearl.)
