What Is a Simple Noun Phrase?

The caterpillar had many shoes.

A simple noun phrase introduces a person, object or animal but with no extra description.

What Is an Expanded Noun Phrase?

The adjective small, adjective friendly
noun caterpillar had a
adjective sturdy, adjective green noun boots.

An expanded noun phrase uses adjectives to describe a noun.



What punctuation mark is between the pairs of adjectives?

How Do We Expand a Noun Phrase?

The caterpillar was on the leaf.

The long, emerald caterpillar was
on the luscious, fresh leaf.

Remember: Try to use two adjectives separated
by a comma before each noun.
