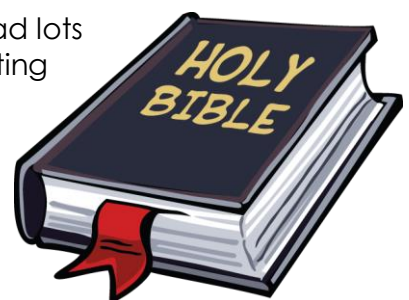
Year 5 Victorian Day
